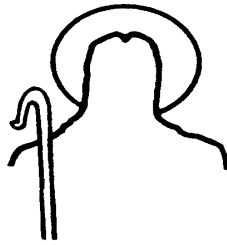

A Letter From the Pastor...

Dear Friends in Christ,

I have changed my name. Often in the world today, our names have no meaning. People frequently give children names they think are cute or quaint, without much thought as to what the name signifies. There was a time when Biblical names were the norm for Christian children, but we don't meet too many *Jebediahs* or *Ephraims* today. (I actually once knew someone named *Cain* – and, yes, he had a brother named *Abel* -- what were their parents thinking?) My parents picked the name *Eric* because it was unusual at the time. Nowadays *Eric* is a common name.

In the Bible names had meaning and that meaning often determined one's destiny. As we discussed in a recent Bible study, *Naomi's* name meant *pleasant*, but after her husband and sons died she changed her name to *Mara* meaning *bitter*. *Simon Peter* was a fisherman, but Jesus changed his name to *Cephas* meaning *rock* because he was the rock on which Jesus would build his church.

Our God has a name. Usually we just say *God* to denote our God. In the Old Testament the Hebrews called God *YHWH*, a name too holy to be said, they thought, so they inserted *The LORD* whenever God's name should have been read out loud. In the New Testament we come to see that the Triune Name, *Father, Son, and Holy Spirit*, is God's proper name. In liturgy it is proper for us to bow and/or make the sign of the cross whenever God's name, *Father, Son, and Holy Spirit*, is said or sung.

September 29, 2009, which was the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels, I joined the Society of the Holy Trinity. This is a group of Lutheran pastors (ELCA, LCMS, WELS, ILF, and others) who come together for worship, study, and mutual support. The Society was formed in 1997. Pastors joining the Society sign *the Rule*, pledge themselves to daily prayer and scripture reading, to a life in obedience to Jesus, and to gathering with other Society members in periodic retreats, among other commitments.

Just as members of the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) put SJ behind their names, so do members of the Society of the Holy Trinity put STS behind their names. The STS comes from the abbreviation of the Latin name for the Society, *Societas Trinitatis Sanctae*. So I am now officially, Pastor Eric Ash, STS.

The letters STS after my name are by no means a status symbol. If anything, they are the opposite, a symbol of humility. That reminder of the Holy Trinity in my name should serve to remind me daily of the One whom I serve, the One I am accountable to, the One who is *Father, Son and Holy Spirit*. Blessed be His Holy Name.

I invite all of you to join with me in worship every Sunday of our God who is *Father, Son and Holy Spirit*, and to strive to conform our lives to His ways by the power of His grace. God the Father is saving us for the sake of God the Son through the work of God the Holy Spirit. Thanks be to God.

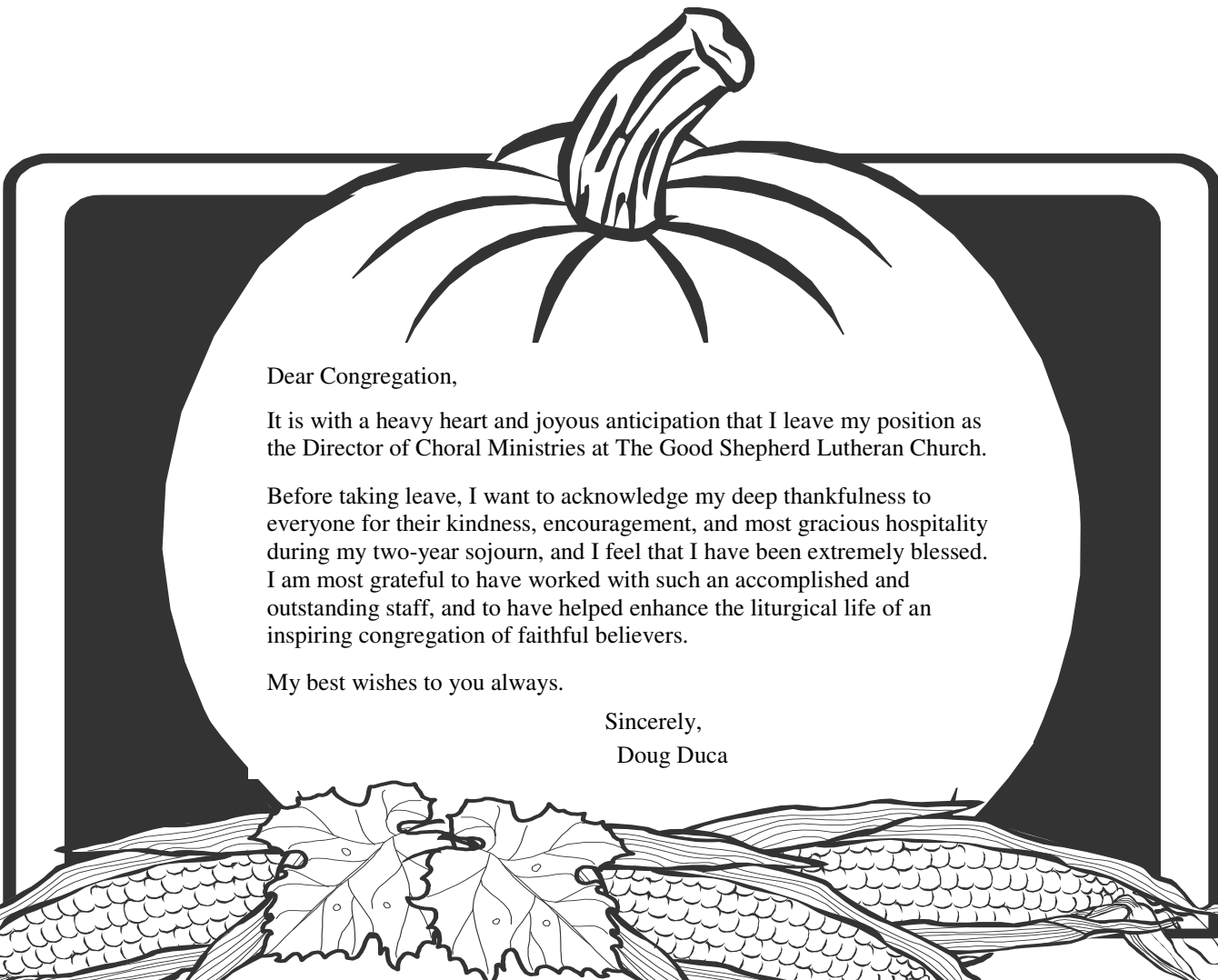

Well, I guess I must be a broken record that repeats and repeats itself. This, of course, repeats my advice of Keeping the Kitchen Klean.

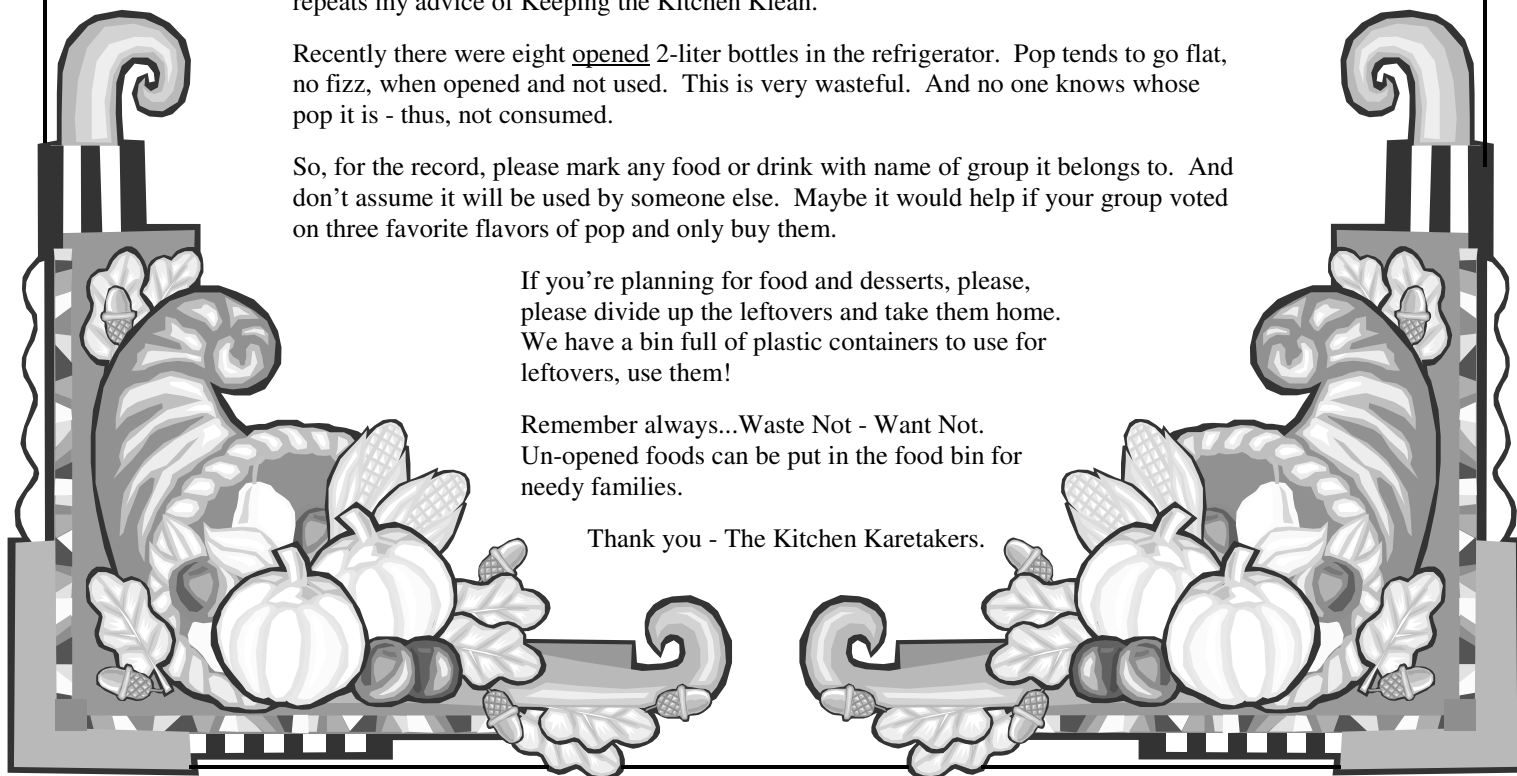

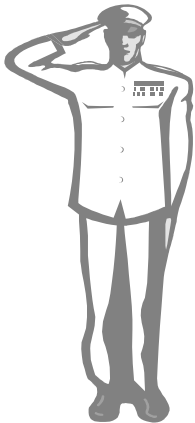

Food Pantry



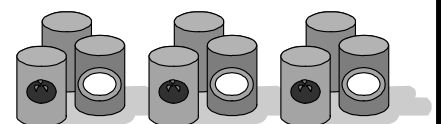
Nancy Smith delivered **18 bags** of food to the **Cross Roads Food Pantry** on **October 5, 2009**.

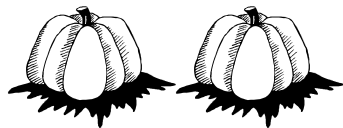

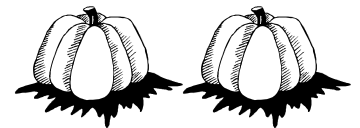

Contemporary Lutheran Issues

Recent developments in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America have precipitated a crisis. The decisions made at the ELCA's Churchwide Assembly last August, especially those decisions regarding human sexuality, have been the cause of much conflict in the ELCA as some people welcome these decisions and others do not. Some pastors have declared themselves to be in protest ("*in statu confessionis*"), some congregations have left or are considering leaving the ELCA (or have stopped remitting their benevolence to the synod/ELCA), and many church members have quit their congregations. What is really at issue here, even more than sexuality, is our Lutheran understanding of the church orders itself and functions). Several of our members have asked for an opportunity to hear more about these issues and how our congregation is responding or can respond to them. Therefore, we will be holding a series of classes taught by Pastor Ash. The classes will be in the form of lectures with some time for questions and answers. Please be advised that we will not be voting on anything, or taking a straw poll, or debating the various positions, or in any way be making decisions on behalf of the congregation at these meetings. To adequately cover the breadth of these issues, we are holding three class sessions, each addressing different aspects of the topic in a progressive manner, i.e., each class building upon the last. To include as many people as possible in these educational sessions, the same class will be offered at three different times:

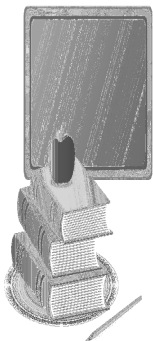
***Tuesdays at 9:30-11:00 AM, Wednesdays at 7:30-8:30 PM, and Sundays at 9:00-10:00 AM (the Adult Forum).** *The schedule and themes are as follows:

The Holy Scriptures: Tuesday, Oct. 27; Wednesday, Oct. 28, and Sunday, November 1
Is the Bible divinely inspired? How do we interpret the Bible? What does it mean to say that for Lutherans "The Bible is our rule and norm for all doctrine? What are law and gospel?

***Marriage, Family and Sexuality*:** Tuesday, November 10; Wednesday, November 11, and Sunday, November 15
What does the Bible and the Lutheran Confessions say about adultery, prostitution, divorce, homosexuality, pornography, and the like? What did the ELCA Churchwide Assembly decide about these issues? How do we apply what the Bible teaches to our lives?

Ecclesiology: Tuesday, November 17; Wednesday, November 18, and Sunday November 22
What is the Church? What does it mean to be a Lutheran? How are decisions made at the local and national levels? Where do our offerings go? What are our options if we want to affirm the church's policy or if we want to protest the church's positions? What is "*in statu confessionis*"?

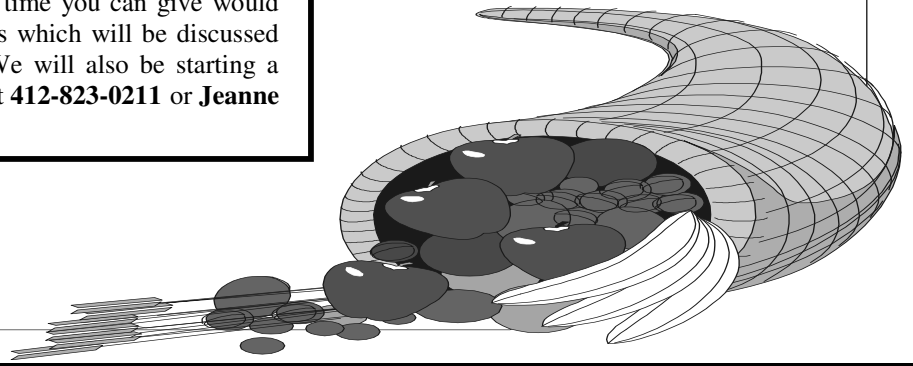


Who's Who In the Bible Answer

Look for the Angel Tree in the narthex this November.


- Pick a paper bell with a child's name

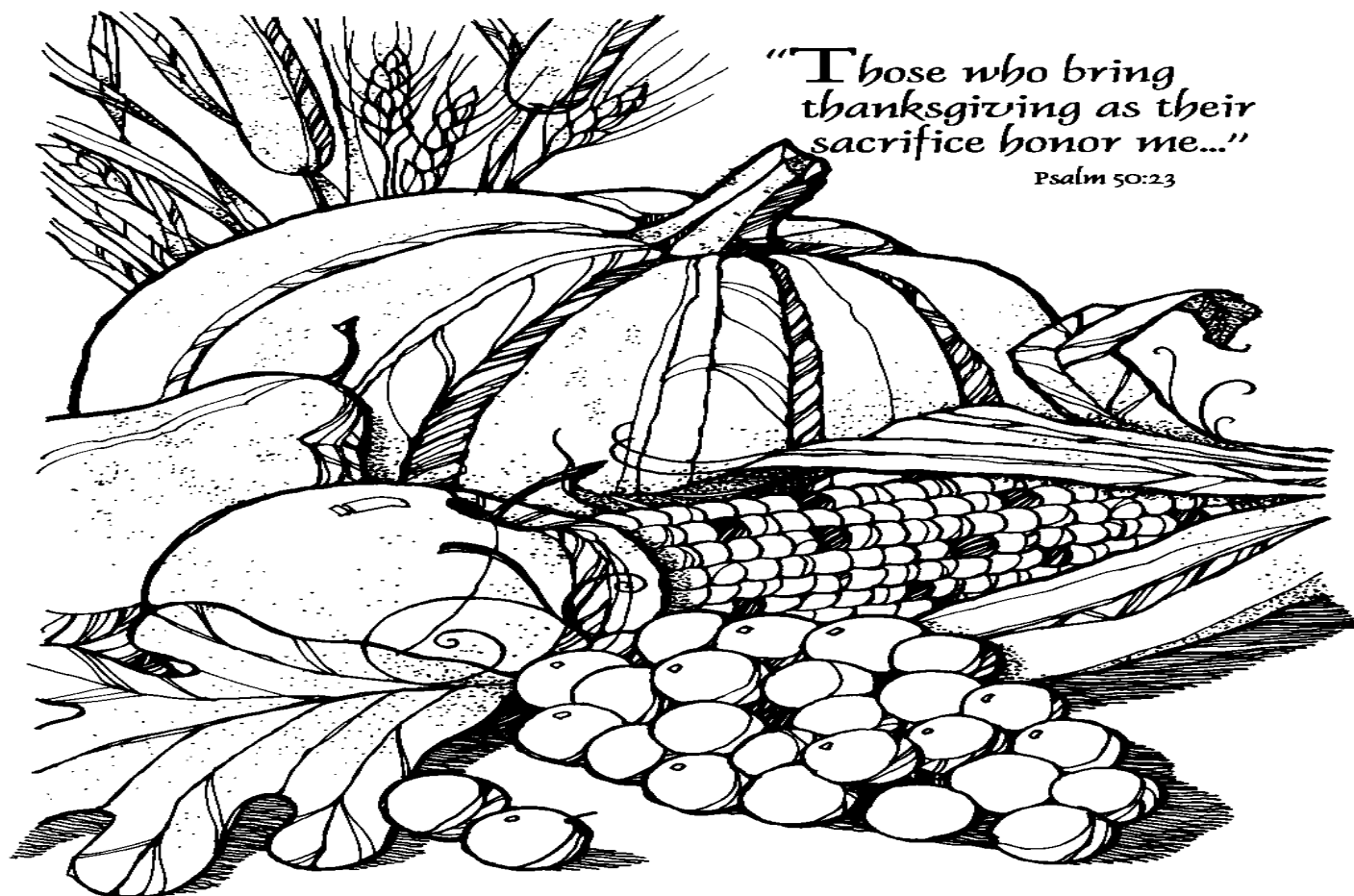
